## HOT CARS AND DOGS IN DANGER! ... BY JEAN GILLES

For several weeks I've read one article after another about dogs dying in HOT cars while their owners are shopping or in one case, swimming to stay cool. Charges were filed in several of these cases however the problem across the country is alarming. So what can YOU do if you see a dog locked in a hot car? Well for starters it's against the law in most areas to break a window or pry open the door so don't go there please. Below is an excerpt from the ASPCA newsletter of some helpful ideas:



Rayne Nolte was in the parking lot of a Mankato, Minnesota, mall last week when she spotted Roxie, a Yorkie mix, trapped in a car. The temperature was 88 degrees with a heat index of 103, and the car's owner was gone.

You may have found yourself in Rayne's situation before. Many pet parents believe that cracking a window is enough to keep their dogs cool in the car while they make a quick pit stop—but they couldn't be more wrong. "Automobile tempera-

tures can very quickly rise to dangerous levels; the average temperature increase in a parked car is 40 degrees, and the majority of this increase occurs in the first 15 to 30 minutes," says Dr. Louise Murray, Vice President of ASPCA Bergh Memorial Animal Hospital. When it's 80 degrees outside, your car will be a staggering 114 degrees after 30 minutes!

Worse still, dogs can't cool themselves down as easily as people, and once they overheat, they can suffer extensive organ damage or die. Luckily, Rayne made all the right moves. Follow her lead by taking these simple steps.

### Step 1: Try to Locate the Pet Parent

Roxie's people were nowhere in sight, so Rayne called mall security, who tried to find Roxie's family through the loudspeaker. (You can ask most stores to do this.)

### Step 2: Educate

Rayne couldn't find Roxie's pet parents, but if you do, explain the dangers of leaving a pet in a hot car. Make sure the pet gets out of the car

as soon as possible.

### Step 3: Call 911

[Fourteen states](#) have enacted specific laws that protect dogs in hot cars, as have many municipalities—but even in places lacking such a law, leaving an animal in a hot car may constitute cruelty.

Rayne and the mall security officers dialed 911. When the police pulled Roxie from the steamy vehicle, she was very ill but soon on the road to recovery.

### Step 4: Pat Yourself on the Back

Pets are counting on people like you to save their lives. Rayne rescued Roxie just in time, and she made a full recovery! And according to the *Mankato Free Press*, the pet-sitter who left Roxie in the car was charged with a petty misdemeanor.

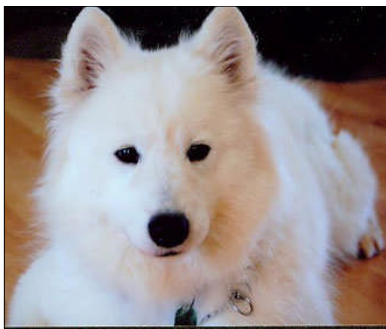

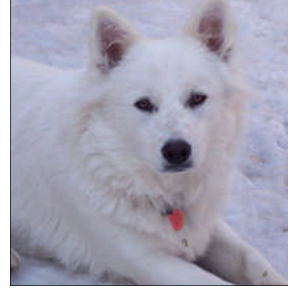
# SAVING LIVES, ONE SMILE AT A TIME

### *Special People with Special Hearts!!*

Thanks to generous Sammie Saviors, NISA's Fur-Kidz who may require specialized veterinary care and daily medications or supplements, are able to receive their every need.

For many this includes a supplement formulated to keep joints and bones lubricated to prevent painful arthritic discomfort. Dosage may require two or more tablets each day. In extreme arthritic conditions it may be necessary to provide Adequan Canine injections (a form of glucosamine) for stronger treatment of arthritic joint inflammation.

Other Diamonds require specialized eye drops to stimulate tear production, eliminate infections, treat corneal abrasions, and dry eyes. This can amount to hundreds of dollars.

Most of NISA's mature Sammies appear to have never had their teeth brushed and heavy calculus requires a professional cleaning. In many cases extractions are necessary due to long term damage from gingivitis and bone loss.

Extensive diagnostics, water therapy, chiropractics, specialized surgeries, more frequent blood chemistries and much more would be cost prohibitive for the general budget. Thankfully all this is possible through the Sammie Savior program.

Your contributions provide a higher quality of life to many Fur-Kidz that NISA couldn't otherwise afford.

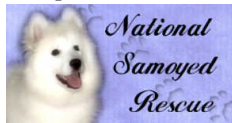
